#### T10. VEHICLE MIRROR BARTON STREET J/W HIGH STREET

DCC Highways have given the following advice. Members to determine if they wish to pursue. "If you wish to install a mirror on private land albeit overhanging the public h/way, with the permission of the landowner(s), we would have no grounds to object to this as long as it is not based on Highway land, it is safe and causes no hazard or nuisance to road users. This would have to be arranged and maintained by yourself and undertaken at your own expense. However, please be advised that if there were to be an accident, and the mirror deemed to the cause, or partial cause, then you might potentially be liable., The mirror would have to be at least 2.4 m above the pavement (bearing in mind the slope) and 450mm back from the edge of the carriageway. In my opinion at this specific location, a mirror would have to be very large in order to give the best view possible. It must be approximately 6/7 m from give way markings to wall of building. Most of the mirrors I've seen in use and have used cover half this distance or less".
